South Dakota Dairy Producers was pleased to award the 2019 Friend of the Dairy Industry to Robert W. Ode of rural Brandon.

Robert himself is a 4th generation dairy farmer on a farm homesteaded by his Grandfather in the late 1800's and was on the front edge of testing to improve performance on his herd. He began testing through the Dairy Herd Improvement Association in 1941 and the farm continues the practice to this day.

Robert has been an active leader for the dairy industry and has served on many boards including the original planning committee that started the Sioux Empire Farm Show. Other boards he has served on include: The stockyard

Andringa is the daughter of Sietse and Aafke Andringa. She has lived on her family's dairy farm her entire life. She lived in Canada until her family moved to Clear Lake when she was two. Andringa is active in public speaking through speech class, FFA and other

Policy:

Many of you would have noted the below excerpt of NMPF's Jim Mulhern's President's Update in his e-mail communication dated April 12th.

SDDP worked with Senator's Thune and Rounds offices, along with Representative Johnson in order to secure the full support of the SD Delegation on this issue by signing on in letters urging Secretary Perdue to prioritize implementation of the dairy provisions included in the Farm Bill.

Perdue Reiterates DMC Timetable – During an appearance this week at a hearing, Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue repeated his pledge that sign-up for the new Dairy Margin Coverage program is a top priority for the department and is on track to begin in June, with payments expected the following month. Perdue also told House lawmakers that he wants the USDA to work with Congress to fashion a disaster aid package that will help Midwestern farmers and ranchers suffering from adverse weather, including grain destroyed and cattle lost because of flooding. Efforts earlier this week to pass a disaster bill foundered over the amount of aid for Puerto Rico.
